Lyell McEwin Hospital

Established in 1959



320 bed teaching hospital, affiliated with the Universities of Adelaide and South Australia. Numerous clinical academic appointments and an active role in teaching.



The hospital has undergone an extensive rebuilding and expansion. It will become the leading research facility and premier health service in the northern suburbs.

The Lyell McEwin Hospital (LMH) boasts an expanded Women's and Children's Health Service and progressive development of surgical and medical sub-specialities wards.

Future plans include an expansion of the Intensive Care Unit, new theatres and day surgery, and a renovated Emergency Department.
